In the case of aircraft engineers, asynchronous communication tends to be more common, as reading aircraft manuals and other technical documentation in English constitutes a significant part of their job duties [2].

Conclusion. Safety has always been a paramount issue in aviation industry. One of the key aspects that have been the focus in reducing aviation safety risk is effective management of maintenance, which is imperative in preventing avoidable accidents or incidents that is caused by mechanical failure of the aircraft system. In absence of maintenance, aircraft parts might deteriorate due to use or age, leading to failures and compromising the operational safety of the aircraft [3, p. 48].

Committed human errors may not be fully due to the maintenance personnel's lack of theoretical or technical skills to perform the tasks, but they can also be influenced by other reasons including language barriers. It has been noted that most incidences related to communication error in the aircraft maintenance organizations that have subsequently led to accident, haste and misunderstanding of maintenance procedure are found to involve non-native English speakers with lack of ability to converse or fully comprehend document in the English language.

At present, International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) is responsible to set the minimum level of English language ability and the standardized test requirements for the international aviation communities [4, p. 201]. However, this English language requirement has been only applicable to pilots and air traffic controllers at the moment. While there have been calls for such requirement to be also applied for all maintenance personnel in the aviation industry, there is still no formal regulation that has been presently enforced.

In conclusion it should be said, that mastering the English language is a fundamental requirement for aviation engineers to excel in their careers, ensure safety in aviation operations, and contribute to the continued advancement of the industry.

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
